STUDENT COUNCIL UPDATE

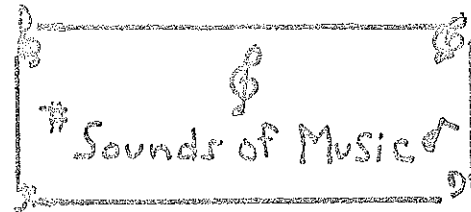
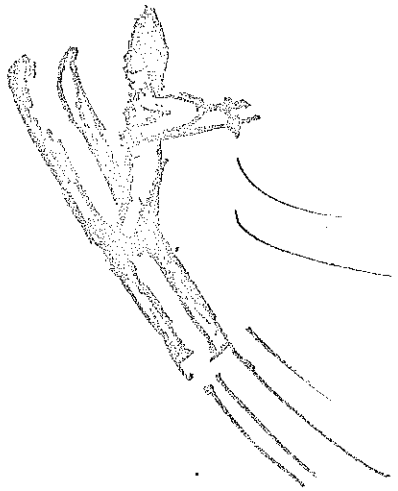

GIRLS BASKETBALL

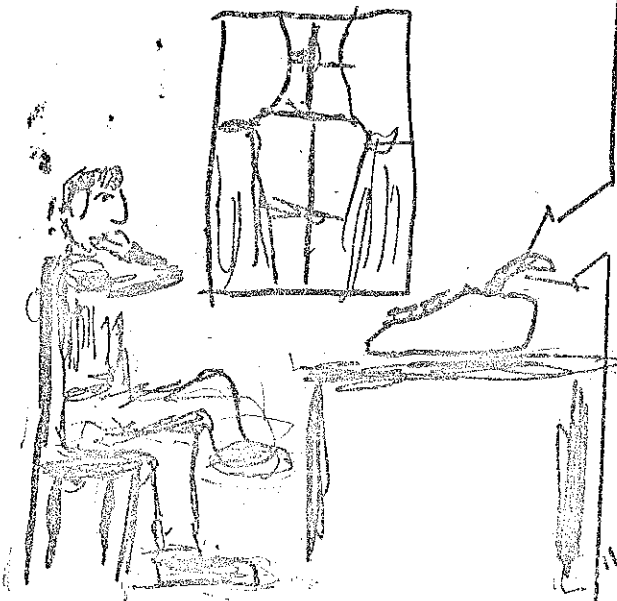
